## Registration Day for Midwifery Program Students

**August 6, 2010 – start time 8:30am**

Registrations are accepted on a first come, first served basis. Registrations will not be processed before this date. Walk-in, faxed (**fax #: 503-760-3332**), and mailed registrations will be date/time stamped in order of receipt. Registrations which are received before the registration start date will be processed at the end of the day on August 6, 2010.

### Registration Deadline: August 27, 2010

Any registrations received after this date will incur a \$75 late fee.

**Fall Term: September 16 – December 10, 2010**

**ATTENTION EXTENSION STUDENTS:** Please remember to register EACH TERM (even if you aren't taking any credits) so you can maintain your enrollment status.

**If you are planning to graduate this term** you must still register and pay the registration fee.

**Payment of tuition and fees is due at the time of registration for each term unless you are eligible for a financial aid disbursement in the term. Equipment kit charges are due when ordered, unless you are on financial aid AND have authorized payment from your financial aid disbursement.** All overdue amounts are subject to finance charges of 15% APR with a \$5 minimum per month. A student must be in good financial standing to register for a new term. Any costs incurred to collect these amounts are the responsibility of the student.

Dear Students,

Over the years, Birthingway has grown in many ways. One way in which we are most proud of our growth is in the type and variety of technological services we are now able to provide. This past spring, at the *New and Continuing Student Orientation*, we requested your feedback on the idea of eliminating print and copy charges, and instead instituting a Technology Fee to cover such costs, as well as the costs associated with additional technological services. After considering your feedback and much discussion, we have decided to implement a \$15 per term *Technology Fee* in fall 2010. This fee will cover both basic and expanded technology services. ### **MIDWIFERY PROGRAM FIRST YEAR CORE COURSES (Required)**

- ♦ **Intrapartum (INT251q)** 5 credit hours. Prerequisite: Antepartum (ANT251q). Co-requisite: Fetal Assessment (FET211q), Prenatal Skills (PRE221q). Twelve sessions. Using lecture, discussion and audio-visual aids, we cover the psychophysiology of labor and birth; biodynamic facilitation of first, second, third, and fourth stages; unusual situations including precipitous birth, cord prolapse, nuchal cord, back labor, abruption, previa, hemorrhage, and third stage issues. Instructor: Holly Scholles, MA, CPM, LDM  
Date: Wednesday mornings starting 9/22 – 12/8/10 for 12 weeks.      Time: 9:00am to 1:15pm      Location: Foster House  
**1<sup>st</sup> Year Lunch:** 1:15pm – 2:00pm      **1<sup>st</sup> Year Cohort:** 2:00pm – 2:45pm
- ♦ **Prenatal Skills (PRE221q)** 2 credit hours. Prerequisites: Antepartum (ANT251q), Physical Assessment I (PHY221q). Co-requisite Intrapartum (INT251q). Twelve sessions. This is a hands-on class mostly involving your hands on bellies! Students learn to do full prenatal exams with real pregnant women. Also includes gloving and ungloving, sterile technique, diastasis recti, and rebozo use in pregnancy. Highly interactive. Instructors: Rhonda Ray, BA, CPM, and Heather Hack, BS, LDM, CPM

### **MIDWIFERY PROGRAM SECOND YEAR CORE COURSES (Required)**

- ♦ **Well-woman Gynecology (GYN341q)** 4 credit hours. Co-requisite: Gynecology Skills (GYN331q) Twelve sessions. Theory based course that explores sexuality, birth control and family planning, pelvic examinations, breast health and examinations. Other topics covered include menstrual disorders, perimenopause and menopause, uterine and cervical abnormalities, and myomata. Instructor: Adeline Kell, ND  
Date: Tuesday mornings starting 9/21 – 12/7/10 for 12 weeks      Time: 9:00am – 12:30pm      Location: Foster House  
**2<sup>nd</sup> Year Lunch;** 12:30pm – 1:30pm      **2<sup>nd</sup> Year Cohort & Case Presentations:** 1:30pm – 2:30pm
- ♦ **Gynecology Skills (GYN331q)** 3 credit hours. Co-requisite: Well-woman Gynecology (GYN341q). Twelve sessions. We require students to have been a member of the cohort currently completing this course for at least one year or by special permission. Skills introduced include bimanual and speculum exams, Paps, cultures, cervical cap and diaphragm fittings, pelvimetry, breast exams, bladder catheterization and wet mounts. Instructor: Adeline Kell, ND

### **MIDWIFERY PROGRAM THIRD YEAR CORE COURSES (Required)**

- ♦ **Critical Care Skills II (CCS422q)** 2 credit hours. Prerequisite: Critical Care Skills I (CCS421q). Twelve sessions. Skills covered in this course include maternal resuscitation and continued practice of I.V. skills. Instructor: Denise Clark, BA, EMT-P  
Date: Thursday mornings starting 9/16 – 12/9/10 for 12 weeks. No class 11/25/10.      Time: 9:00am – 11:00am      Location: Foster House Skills Room  
**3<sup>rd</sup> Year Cohort & Case Presentations:** 11:00am – 12:30pm,      **3<sup>rd</sup> Year Lunch:** 12:30pm – 1:30pm
- ♦ **Psychosocial Issues (PSY441q)** 4 credit hours. Prerequisites: Antepartum (ANT251q), Intrapartum (INT251q). Twelve sessions. Using lecture, discussion, guest speakers, and student presentations, this course covers social issues as they impact on clinical care, including socioeconomic class, literacy, family structures, sexual orientation, sexual abuse, domestic violence, adolescent pregnancy, adoption, surrogacy and reproductive technology. Instructor: Holly Scholles, MA, CPM, LDM  
Date: Thursday afternoons starting 9/16 – 12/9/10 for 12 weeks. No class 11/25/10.      Time: 1:30pm – 5:00pm      Location: Foster House

### **SUPPLEMENTAL COURSES**

- ♦ **Breastfeeding Skills (BFS411q)** 1 credit hour. Prerequisite: Breastfeeding II (BRF222q). Four sessions. Students develop their hands-on skills by working with nursing women and their babies to demonstrate breast exams, practice supporting a successful latch, and how to use a variety of equipment such as breast pumps and nipple shields. This supplemental is required for graduation for students in the 2010 cohort and later; it is recommended in the spring of third year. All other Midwifery Program Students (2009 cohort and earlier) may take this to meet your elective requirement. Instructor: Rita Aparicio, MA, IBCLC

### **Recommended Supplementals for First Year Students:**

- ♦ **Breastfeeding I (BRF211q)** 1 credit hour. Four sessions. Using lecture, discussion, visual aids, and small group activities, this course provides students with basic information about topics including the normal breastfeeding physiology of mother and baby, properties of human milk, risks of formula feeding, recommendations regarding breastfeeding initiation, duration and normal parameters of nursing in the first two weeks, politics of breastfeeding, and influences of culture and birth practices on breastfeeding. Instructor: Adrienne Fuson, BA, IBCLC, LMT, CD  
Date: Monday mornings on 10/18, 11/1, 11/15, 11/29/10      Time: 9:30am – 12:30pm      Location: Carlton House
- ♦ **Fetal Assessment (FET211q)** 1 credit hour. Co-requisite: Intrapartum (INT251q). Three sessions. This course covers methods for evaluating fetal well-being, including monitoring and analyzing fetal heart tones using a doppler or fetascope, fetal movement counts, sonogram, Auscultated Acceleration Test (AAT), the Non-Stress Test (NST), the Biophysical Profile (BPP), Amniotic Fluid Index (AFI), and other methods. Instructor: Holly Scholles, MA, CPM, LDM

- ◆ **Childbirth Educator (CBE241q)** 4 credit hours. Six sessions. Examine the history of childbirth education and preconceptions about birth, while building tools for developing a childbirth education series based on Birthingway's biodynamic model. ### **Recommended Supplementals for Second Year Students:**

- ◆ **Botanicals II (BOT332q)** 3 credit hours. Prerequisite: Botanicals I (BOT331q). Ten sessions. Materia medica for fertility, preconception, pregnancy, intrapartum, postpartum, infancy and well-woman gynecology. Instructor: Mindy Cash, ND  
Date: Monday afternoons on 9/27, 10/4, 10/11, 10/25, 11/1, 11/8, 11/15, 11/22, 11/29, 12/6/10      Time: 1:30pm – 4:30pm      Location: Foster House
- ◆ **Communications II (COM312q)** 1 credit hour. Prerequisite: Communication I (COM321q). Four sessions. The second course in the communication series continues the development of self and one-on-one communication skills. The emphasis in this course is on working with preceptors and clients. Instructor: Celeste Kersey, BA, CPM, LDM  
Date: Friday mornings on 10/1, 10/15, 10/29, 11/12/10. Make up on 11/19/10      Time: 9:00am – 12:00pm      Location: Foster House
- ◆ **Plant Medicine II (PLM322q)** 2 credit hours. Prerequisite: Plant Medicine I (PLM321q). Seven sessions. Learn about topical applications, preparation of herbal baths, hydrosols, succi, salves and creams. This course includes a field trip. Instructor: Cari Nyland, ND  
Date: Wednesday afternoons on 9/22, 9/29, 10/6, 10/20, 11/3, 11/17, 12/1/10      Time: 1:00pm – 4:00pm      Location: Carlton House
- ◆ **Sexually Transmitted Infections (STI311q)** 1 credit hour. Prerequisite: Microbiology (MIC341q). Three sessions. Using lecture, discussion and student presentations, this course covers common and rare sexually transmitted diseases and their causative microorganisms, risk factors, signs and symptoms, diagnosis, and treatment, as well as impact on mother, fetus, and newborn. Diseases covered include syphilis, gonorrhea, chlamydia, herpes simplex, HPV, HIV, hepatitis, chancre, parasites. Instructor: Mia Crupper, ND

### **Recommended Supplementals for Third Year Students:**

- ◆ **Ethics (ETH421q)** 2 credit hours. Five sessions. This course is a survey of philosophical foundations of contemporary ethical models. We explore problem solving of ethical dilemmas that may occur in a midwifery practice. Some topics include autonomy and informed choice, relationships, and justice. Instructor: Nichole Reding, MA

- ◆ **Human Genetics (GEN431q)** 3 credit hours. Ten sessions. Covers basic genetic concepts, genetic screening, pregnancy counseling, and common genetic disorders such as sickle cell, Tay-Sachs, and trisomy disorders. . Instructor: Martha von Reis, MA  
Date: Monday evenings 10/4 – 12/6/10 for 10 weeks      Time: 5:45pm – 8:45pm      Location: Foster House
- ◆ **Research Methods (RSM411q)** 1 credit hour. *Prerequisite: Understanding Statistics (STA221q).* Six sessions. Tools, methods, and techniques for designing and implementing a research project. Instructor: Kathryn H. Constant, MLS  
Date: Thursday evenings. 9/16/10 5:30-7:30; 9/23/10 5:30-8:00; 9/30/10 5:30-8:30; 10/14, 10/21, 10/28/10 5:30-8:00      Location: Foster House
- ◆ **Research Project (RSP411q)** 1 credit hour *Prerequisite: Research Methods (RSM411q).* This course focuses on the design and implementation of a research project, including definition of a topic, literature review, creation of bibliography and the production of a research paper. **Please download a Research Project Registration Packet at [www.birthingway.edu/registration.htm](http://www.birthingway.edu/registration.htm) or request one in the front office. A completed Research Project Registration Form must be turned in (with payment) by the first day of the term to register.**
- ◆ **Working Cross Culturally (WCC411q)** 1 credit hour. Four sessions. Using lecture, discussions, guest speakers and student presentations, this course covers general principles of working with someone from a culture other than your own, with focus on specific religious and ethnic groups, and their beliefs and practices in the childbearing year. Instructor: Holly Scholles, MA, CPM, LDM  
Date: Monday mornings, 10/25, 11/8, 11/22, 12/6/10      Time: 9:00am – 12:00pm      Location: Foster House

### **ELECTIVE COURSES**

- ◆ **Breastfeeding III (BRF313q)** 1 credit hour. Prerequisite: Breastfeeding II (BRF222q). Four sessions. Case studies and development of protocols deepen students' knowledge of breastfeeding counseling. Students focus on more complex situations including failure to thrive and infant hypoglycemia, as well as professional issues such as scope of practice, ethics, and credentials. Dates and Times: Mondays, 9/20/10 and 10/4/10 from 9:30am – 12:30pm, 10/18/10 and 11/8/10 from 1:30pm – 4:30pm.      Location: Carlton House
- ◆ **International Midwifery (ITL311q)** 1 credit hour. Four sessions. We explore midwifery abroad from developing countries to other industrialized states. This course examines legal, health, social, economic and political topics. Instructor: Carrie McCormick, MPH  
Date: Tuesday evenings on 9/21, 9/28, 10/5, 10/19/10      Time: 5:30pm – 8:30pm      Location: Foster House
- ◆ **Spanish for Birth Professionals (SPA311q)** 1 credit hour. Four sessions. An introduction to basic vocabulary and phrasing for birth professionals. Instructor: Rita Aparicio, MA, IBCLC  
Date: Friday afternoons on 11/1, 11/15, 11/22 and 11/29      Time: 1:00pm – 4:00pm      Location: Carlton House
- ◆ **Independent Study (IND311q)** 1-3 credit hours. Student led independent research with an approved faculty member. Students interested in pursuing an Independent Study must initially complete an *Intent Form* designating the proposed topic, advisor and credit value. Please meet with the Student Affairs Coordinator or the Faculty Coordinator for more information. Allow 4-6 weeks prior to the term in which you will pursue the Independent Study to complete all preparatory steps.
