

Midwifery and Lactation Program Winter 2012 Registration begins:

Registrations are accepted on a first come, first served basis. Registrations will not be processed before this date. Walk-in, faxed (fax #: 503-760-3332), and mailed registrations will be date/time stamped in order of receipt. Registrations which are received before the registration start date and time will be processed at the end of the day on November 21, 2011.

Payment of tuition and fees is due at the time of registration for each term unless you are eligible for a financial aid disbursement in the term. Equipment kit charges are due when ordered, unless you are on financial aid AND have authorized payment from your financial aid disbursement. All overdue amounts are subject to finance charges of 15% APR with a \$5 minimum per month. A student must be in good financial standing to register for a new term. Any costs incurred to collect these amounts are the responsibility of the student. COURSE OFFERING – Winter 2012

- ◆ **ADVANCED BREASTFEEDING SKILLS I (LADS221q) 2 credit hours. 6 sessions. Prerequisite: Breastfeeding III (BRF313q) and Breastfeeding Skills (BFS411q)** This course is designed for lactation students to learn about advanced assessment skills, care plan implementation and proper breastfeeding device usage. During the course we will focus on honing and implementing clinical skills that pertain to lactation. This class is a pre-requisite to Advanced Breastfeeding Skills II.
Date: Tuesdays on 1/31, 2/7, 2/14, 2/21, 2/28, 3/6/12 Time: 1:00pm – 5:00pm Location: Carlton House

- ◆ **BOTANICALS III (BOT313q) 1 credit hour. 5 Sessions. Prerequisite: Botanicals II (BOT 332q)** Study specific herbs that are versatile and effective for a variety of conditions in women's health and in midwifery applications. Students create treatment plans for "client" classmates using botanical medicine, modifying as necessary and charting appropriately. Taught by Mindy Cash, ND
Date: Fridays on 1/6, 1/13, 1/20, 1/27, 2/3/12 Time: 9:00am – 11:30am Location: Foster House

- ◆ **BREASTFEEDING II (BRF222q) 2 credit hours. 5 sessions. Prerequisite: Breastfeeding I (BRF211q)** Students expand on their knowledge from BRF211 to assess and treat breastfeeding problems. Students utilize case studies and research projects to develop skills such as how to take a breastfeeding history of mother and baby, identification of presenting problems, and integrating counseling and education strategies into their breastfeeding support. Taught by Adrienne Fuson, BA, IBCLC, LMT, CD
Date: Mondays on 1/9, 1/23, 2/6, 2/20, 3/5/12 Time: 9:30am – 1:30pm Location: Carlton House

- ◆ **BREASTFEEDING POLITICS AND POLICY (LPOL121q) 2 credit hours. 7 sessions.** WHO recommendations and implementation, Federal programs such as WIC, history of artificial feeding, social and cultural issues around breastfeeding, ideas for being agents of change in the area of breastfeeding. Includes historical and contemporary topics, with theory and action-oriented projects. Taught by Rita Aparicio, MA, IBCLC and Carrie McCormick, MPH
Date: Wednesdays on 1/11, 1/18, 1/25, 2/8, 2/15, 3/7, 3/14 /12 Time: 1:00pm – 4:00pm Location: Carlton House

- ◆ **CHINESE MEDICINE (CHM311q) 1 credit hour. 5 sessions.** An introduction to Traditional Chinese Medicine as a healing modality and its relevance to midwifery. Practices include moxibustion and acupressure. Taught by Mindy Cash, ND
Date: Fridays on 2/10, 2/17, 2/24, 3/2, 3/9/12 Time: 9:00am – 11:30am Location: Foster House

- ◆ **COMMUNICATIONS II (COM312q) 1 credit hour. 4 Sessions. Prerequisite: Communication I (COM321q).** The second course in the communication series continues the development of self and one-on-one communication skills. The emphasis in this course is on working with preceptors and clients. Taught by Sarah Peyton, BA
Date: Thursdays on 1/5, 1/12, 1/19, 2/2/12 Time: 1:30pm – 4:30pm Location: Carlton House

- ◆ **COMMUNICATIONS III (COM313q) 1 credit hour. 4 sessions. Prerequisite: Communication II (COM312q).** The final course in the communication series continues development of communication skills with an emphasis on working with peers and other health care providers. Taught by Celeste Kersey, BA
Date: Thursdays on 2/16, 2/23, 3/8, 3/15/12 makeup on 3/22/12 Time: 1:00pm – 4:00pm Location: Carlton House

- ◆ **COMPLEX SITUATIONS I (CPX341q) 4 credit hours. 12 sessions. Prerequisites: Antepartum (ANT251q), Intrapartum (INT251q) Fetal Assessment (FET211q).** Using lecture, discussion and case studies, this course covers anemia, clotting issues (thrombophilias, deficiencies, DIC), respiratory issues (asthma, amniotic fluid embolism, pulmonary embolism), energy issues (diabetes, hypoglycemia, eating disorders), liver problems (HELLP, acute fatty liver, intrahepatic cholestasis), thyroid issues, and dermatologic conditions (PUPPP, HG). Taught by Holly Scholles, MA, CPM, LDM
Date: Wednesdays, 1/4 – 3/21/12 for 12 weeks Time: 1:30pm – 5:00pm Location: Foster House

- ◆ **DIFFERENTIAL DIAGNOSIS (DIF431q) 3 credit hours. 12 sessions. Prerequisites: All midwifery core courses, and Fetal Assessment (FET211q), Sexually Transmitted Infections (STI311q).** We recommend all midwifery courses are complete or in progress before taking this course. Using student created *Signs and Symptoms* book and protocols, students present case studies for differential diagnosis by their classmates. Students also create practice guidelines for antepartum, intrapartum, postpartum, and well-woman gynecology, as well as develop risk assessment guidelines and client care checklists. Taught by Holly Scholles, MA, CPM, LDM
Date: Tuesdays, 1/3 – 3/20/12 for 12 weeks Time: 2:15pm – 5:00pm Location: Foster House

- ◆ **HEMATOLOGY SKILLS (HEM321q) 2 credit hours. 12 sessions. Prerequisite: Prenatal Skills (PRE221q)** Skills covered include hemoglobin, hematocrit, and glucose evaluations with in-office devices. Venipuncture skills are also covered, including vacutainer, syringe and butterfly devices, as well as introduction to IV skills. Taught by Denise Clark, BA, EMT-P
Date: Wednesdays, 1/4 – 3/21/12 for 12 weeks Time: 9:00am – 11:00am Location: Foster House

- ◆ **HOMEOPATHY I (HOM221q) 2 credit hours. 5 sessions.** An introduction to the concepts and laws of homeopathy, focusing on the use of homeopathic medicine in first aid and midwifery. This is primarily a lecture-based class, with some hands on learning experiences. Taught by Jennifer Means, ND
Date: Wednesdays on 1/18, 2/1, 2/15, 2/29, 3/14/12 Time: 9:30am – 1:30pm Location: Carlton House

- ◆ **INFANCY (INF221q) 2 credit hours. 7 sessions.** From an ethnopediatric perspective, this course covers newborn behavior, development, bonding and attachment, and childrearing including attachment parenting. Taught by Heather Hack-Sullivan, BSM, CPM, LDM
Date: Wednesdays on 1/4/12, 1/11, 1/25, 2/8, 2/22, 3/7, 3/21/12 Time: 9:00am – 12:00pm Location: Carlton House

COURSE OFFERING – Winter 2012

- ◆ **MASSAGE FOR MIDWIVES (MAS321q) 2 credit hours. 3 sessions.** An introduction to the psychology of touch, we learn basic massage techniques with an emphasis on pregnancy and postpartum. Taught by Bonnie McAnnis, BA, LMT
Date: Friday 1/13 5:00pm – 9:00pm, Saturday 1/14 9:00am – 5:00pm, Sunday 1/15 9:00am – 5:00pm Location: Carlton House

- ◆ **MATERNAL COMPLEX BREASTFEEDING (LMCS231q) 3 credit hours. 10 sessions. Prerequisite: Breastfeeding III (BRF313q)** This course covers a variety of more complicated physiologic scenarios for mother including: breast surgery (reductions, enlargements and cancer); nipple issues (flat, inverted etc.); genetic disorders; milk production; drug interactions. In addition, it covers psychosocial issues, such as socioeconomic issues, literacy issues, social support (lack thereof), teen moms, cultural issues in US, grief, family transition, anorexia nervosa and other eating disorders, and Perinatal Mood Disorders. Taught by Rita Aparicio, MA, IBCLC
Date: Tuesdays, 1/3 – 3/6/12 for 10 weeks. Time: 9:30am – 12:30pm Location: Carlton House

- ◆ **PHARMACOLOGY (PHR421q) 2 credit hours. 7 sessions. Registration for this course limited to midwifery program students, midwives and approved community students.** Basic pharmacology theory, legend drugs and devices used in a midwifery practice, and administration of medications including injection techniques. Course meets Legend Drugs and Devices educational requirements for Pharmacology and Medications by Injection required for Oregon midwifery licensure. Taught by Pamela Echeverio, BS, CPM, LDM
Date: Tuesdays, 1/24 – 3/6/12 for 7 weeks. Makeup 3/13/12 Time: 6:00pm – 9:00pm Location: Foster House

- ◆ **PLANT MEDICINE III (PLM323q) 2 credit hours. 7 sessions. Prerequisite: Plant Medicine I (PLM322q).** Learn preparation of syrups, cordials and elixirs, as well as lozenges and suppositories, oxymels and electuaries. Create herbal formulas and prescriptions. This course includes a field trip. Taught by Carrie Nyland, ND
Date: Fridays, 2/3 – 3/16 for 7 weeks. Time: 1:30pm – 4:30pm Location: Carlton House

- ◆ **POSTPARTUM (PTM251q) 5 credit hours. 12 sessions. Prerequisites: Antepartum (ANT251q), Intrapartum (INT251q). Co-requisite: Postpartum Skills (PTM221q).** This course covers unique fetal anatomy and physiology, fetal transformation, newborn examination and age assessment. In addition, learn neonatal procedures; behavioral states; breastfeeding; infant postpartum assessment, care and complications; maternal assessment and care; maternal postpartum complications; postpartum emotional disorders. Taught by Lucina Armstrong, BA, CPM, LDM
Date: Thursdays, 1/5 – 3/22/12 for 12 weeks Time: 9:00am – 1:15pm Location: Foster House

- ◆ **POSTPARTUM SKILLS (PTM221q) 2 credit hours. 12 sessions. Co-requisite: Postpartum (PTM251q).** Skills covered include newborn physical and gestational age exam and evaluation, use of growth charts, blood estimation, placenta examination. Taught by Heather Hack-Sullivan, BSM, CPM, LDM
Date: Thursdays, 1/5 – 3/22/12 for 12 weeks Time: 3:00pm – 5:00pm Location: Foster House

- ◆ **PRACTICE PROTOCOLS BOOK (PRP411q) 1 credit hour. 5 sessions. Prerequisites: All required midwifery program courses must be completed or in progress.** In this capstone course, students apply the practice they've created throughout the midwifery curriculum to practice scenarios with a standardized patient. Taught by Jacqueline Meyer, CPM
Date: Mondays on 1/2, 1/16, 1/30, 2/13, 3/5/12 Time: 4:45pm – 7:00pm Location: Carlton House

- ◆ **RESEARCH PROJECT (RSP411q) 1 credit hour. Prerequisite: Research Methods (RSM411q).** This course focuses on the design and implementation of a research project, including definition of a topic, literature review, creation of bibliography and the production of a research paper. **Please download a Research Project Registration Packet at www.birthingway.edu/registration.htm or request one in the front office. A completed Research Project Registration Form must be turned in (with payment) by the first day of the term to register.**

- ◆ **RUNNING A MIDWIFERY PRACTICE (RUN441q) 4 credit hours. 12 sessions.** This course explores developing and structuring a practice, including deciding which products and services to offer. Covers business management and bookkeeping, informed consent, malpractice, legal concepts and requirements. Also includes getting reimbursed, working with insurance companies and HIPAA compliance. Students produce a complete Business Plan and a community resource tool. Taught by Susan Moray, CPM, LDM
Date: Tuesdays, 1/3 – 3/20/12 for 12 weeks Time: 9:00am – 12:15pm Location: Foster House

- ◆ **SURVEY OF OTHER MODALITIES (SOM321q) 2 credit hours. 7 sessions.** A survey style course, covering a variety of alternative healing modalities, including chiropractic, flower essences, aromatherapy, body work and hydrotherapy, with indicators for referral. Taught by Carrie Nyland, ND

- ◆ **UNDERSTANDING MEDICAL LITERATURE (UML221q) 2 credit hours. 6 sessions.** Basic statistical concepts, types of medical literature, critical analysis, evidence-based medicine. Taught by Kathryn H. Constant, MLS and Nancy Longatan, MEd

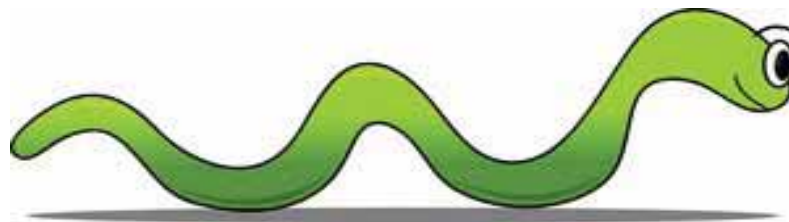
